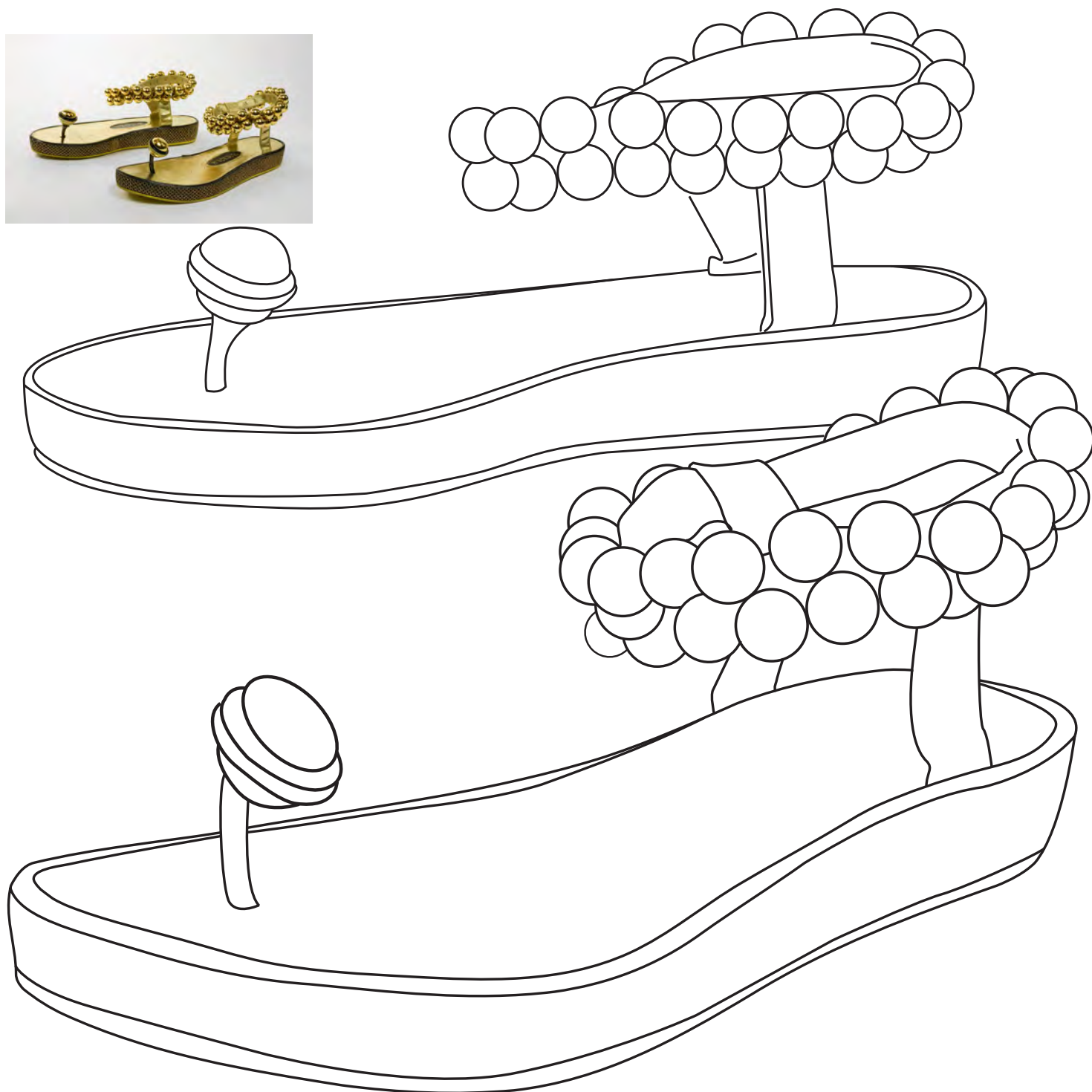


In Ancient Egypt, mummy cases called cartonnage were frequently decorated with gold. By the Ptolemaic period (305 to 30 B.C.E.), increasing numbers of people sought to be mummified after death and cartonnage that only encased the head and feet became popular.

These thick-soled sandals were made by English shoe manufacturers Rayne and date to the mid 1960s. Their design is based on the *Paduka*, a form of toe-knobbed footwear from India. Western fashion in this decade borrowed heavily from cultures from around the world in ways that today might be seen as highly problematic.
