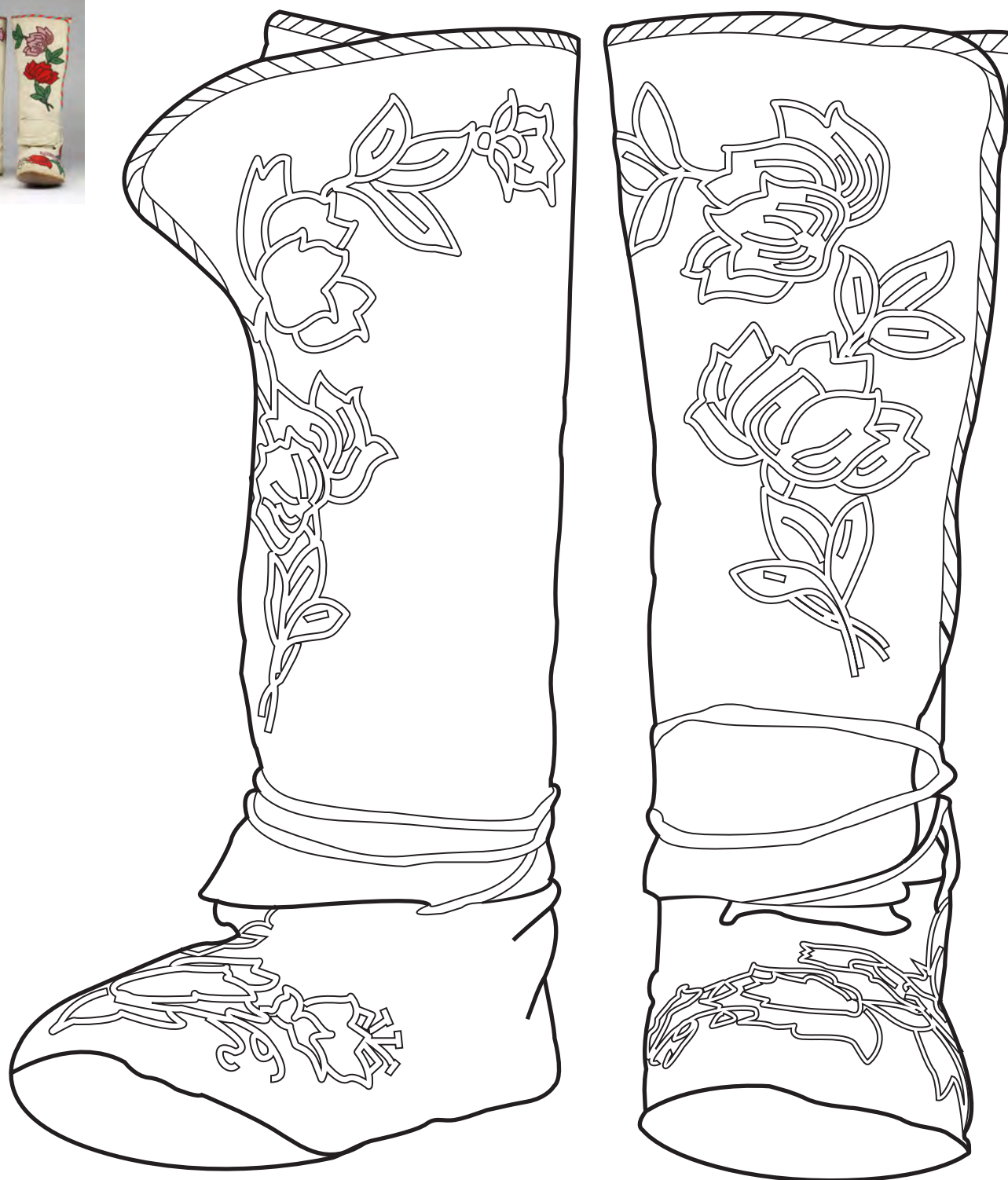


COLOURING THE WORLD AT YOUR FEET

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This pair of Apsaalooke boots features dramatic oversized floral patterns across the vamps and shafts. Indigenous artists of the Great Plains are known for their extremely intricate beadwork, and this pair features thousands of tiny, faceted glass beads in a variety of colours.
