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This award-winning evening sandal was made by Bally in 1939. During the Great Depression, gold was promoted as a fugal choice for evening shoes because it could be worn with dresses of any colour.

BALLY • SWISS • 1939

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This glamorous pair of shoes features carved wooden heels rivaling streamline modern sculpture. They were designed by Steven Arpad for Delman in the late 1930s.

AMERICAN • c. 1939



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
Renowned French shoe designer André Perugia rose to fame in the 1920s. As with many of Perugia's designs, this pair was ahead of its time and inspired imitation in the 1930s.

FRENCH • c. 1927

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This pair of rubber, "silver wing" bathing shoes was made by Phillips in 1934. The bold silver wing on the side suggested both the winged feet of the ancient Greek messenger god, Hermes and modern art deco design

ENGLISH • 1934
