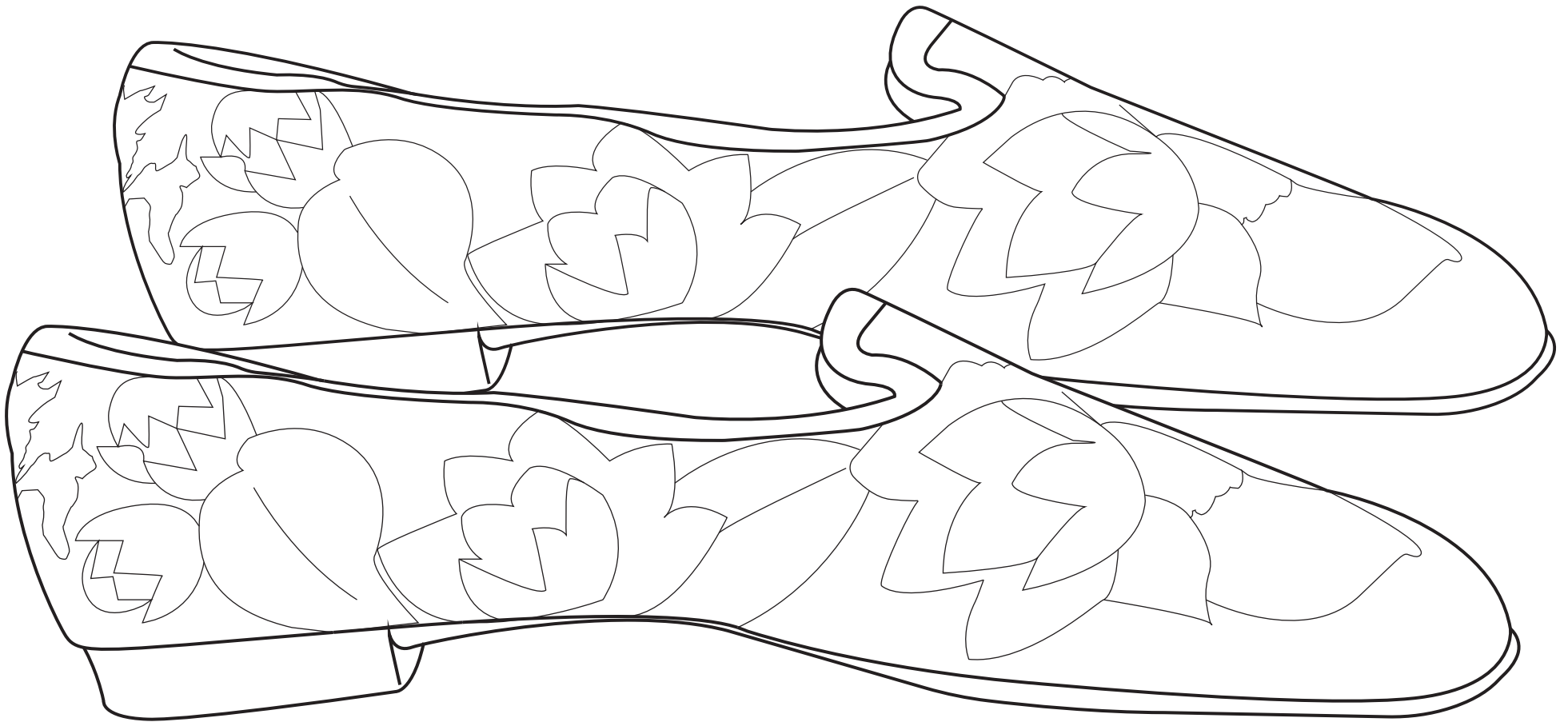


Colouring THE WORLD AT YOUR FEET

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This pair of men's house slippers features Berlin work; a type of embroidery that was hugely popular in Europe during the 19th century. Often, women would embroider the uppers at home and then take them to a shoemaker to be soled.
