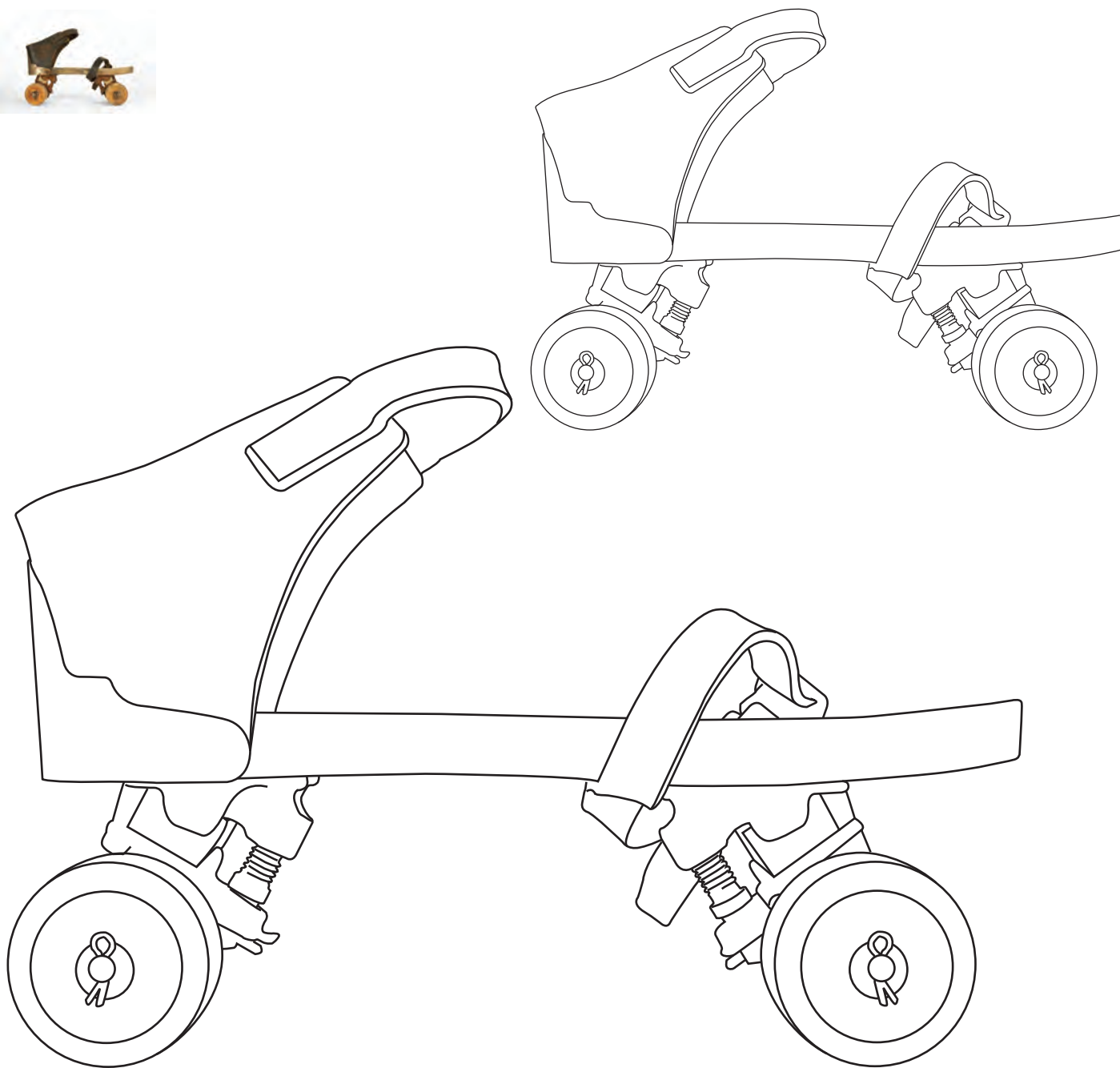


Colouring

THE WORLD AT YOUR FEET

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Roller skates became popular across Europe and North America in the nineteenth century. This pair from the 1890s features wooden wheels.

AMERICAN • c. 1890s

Colouring

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This pair of men's *Kamiks* was made by Mary Battye from Pangnirtung in Nunavut. They were made using caribou hide for warmth and sealskin for durability.

NUNATSIARMIUT • 1987

Colouring

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In the mid-19th century, side-lacing boots called Adelaides were fashionable. This pair features dominos created out of beadwork and black white lace. These details were added by the wearer most likely for wear to a “fancy dress” ball.

AMERICAN • c. 1860s

Colouring

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This pair of Victorian button boots conveys a sense of opulence through the use of highly decorative brocaded fabric. Button boots were closed using button hooks.
