Youth Volunteer Position Description

Have fun and help others, be part of Toronto's most unusual museum, and get your community service hours!

Volunteer Position: Activity Leader

Description: Youth Volunteers help make the museum fun and interactive for kids of all ages. Volunteers greet kids and parents and lead children's crafts and activities. The museum offers four family programs annually: Halloween, Christmas, Family Day Fun, and a March Break Program (with a new theme every year!). Youth Volunteers may volunteer for one of these events, or all four!

Halloween 2019: Saturday, October 26th 9:30am-4:30pm; Sunday, October 27th 11:30am-4:30pm Christmas 2019: Sunday, December 15th 11:30am-4:30pm Family Day 2020: Monday, February 17th 9:30am-4:30pm

March Break 2020: Saturday, March 14th - Saturday March, 16th 9:30am-4:30pm daily; Sunday March 22nd 11:30am-5pm (orientation and training session held after school on Thursday March 12th)

Skills and Requirements:

-age 14-17 -enjoy arts & crafts and working with people

-want to volunteer in a museum -like working in a busy environment

-punctual and reliable -experience with children (i.e. babysitting) -courteous and respectful -have lots of energy and enthusiasm!

Orientation and Training: Orientation and training will be provided for all youth volunteer positions. Youth Volunteers will be trained and supervised by Sheila Knox and/or Andrea Field.

Time Commitment: Youth Volunteers are asked to commit to at least one full day for Halloween, Christmas, and Family Day events, and a minimum of four days over March Break.

Benefits: Why Volunteer? Meet new people, gain skills and experience, help your community, and get your community service hours required for graduation.

Expectations for Volunteer Involvement:

Personal Appearance: Please remember that you are representing the museum when you volunteer. This means that you should be dressed appropriately for this role. Jeans and sneakers are okay, but please do not wear ripped jeans or articles of clothing meant for mature audiences. We encourage volunteers to dress in 'child-friendly' costumes or holiday themed clothing for Halloween and Christmas events.

Name Badge: All volunteers are required to wear a name badge when volunteering at the museum.

Cell Phones: Cell phones and other electronic devices should not be visible during your volunteer service. All devices must be turned to silent when you enter the museum.

Valuables: We do not have a secure place for valuables so please leave tablets, electronics and other items of value at home. The museum is not responsible for lost or damaged valuables.

Attendance: Commitment is essential. We cannot run the events without you! This means following through with the commitment that you have made and arriving on time.

Community Service Hours: Hours sheets will be signed at the end of the last shift of each event.

Food: The museum does not sell food, so you should bring a lunch or plan to purchase your lunch offsite. Snacks will be provided. Please notify the supervisor of any allergies or medical conditions that we should be aware of after you have been selected to volunteer. Please note that the museum is not a nut or scent free environment.
